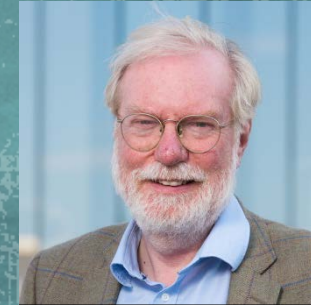

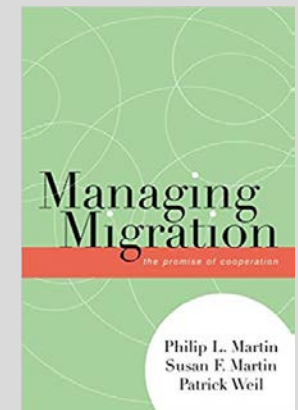

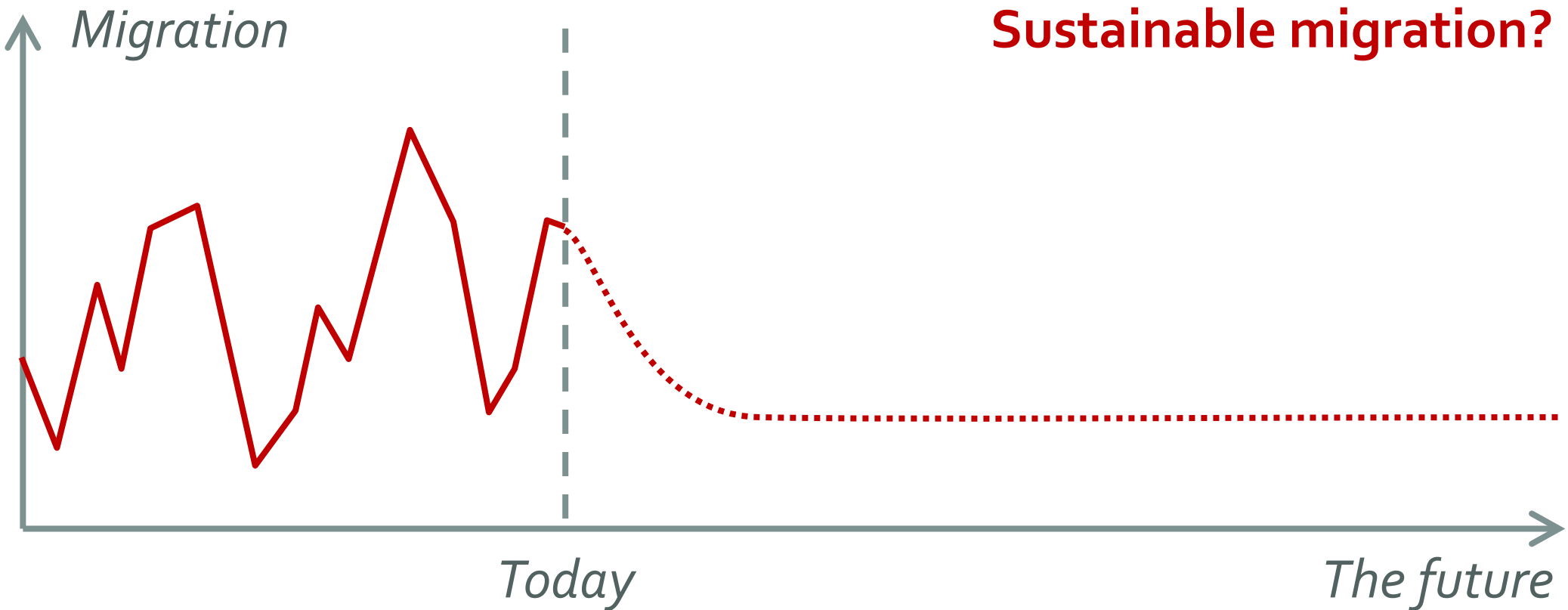

today and in the future.



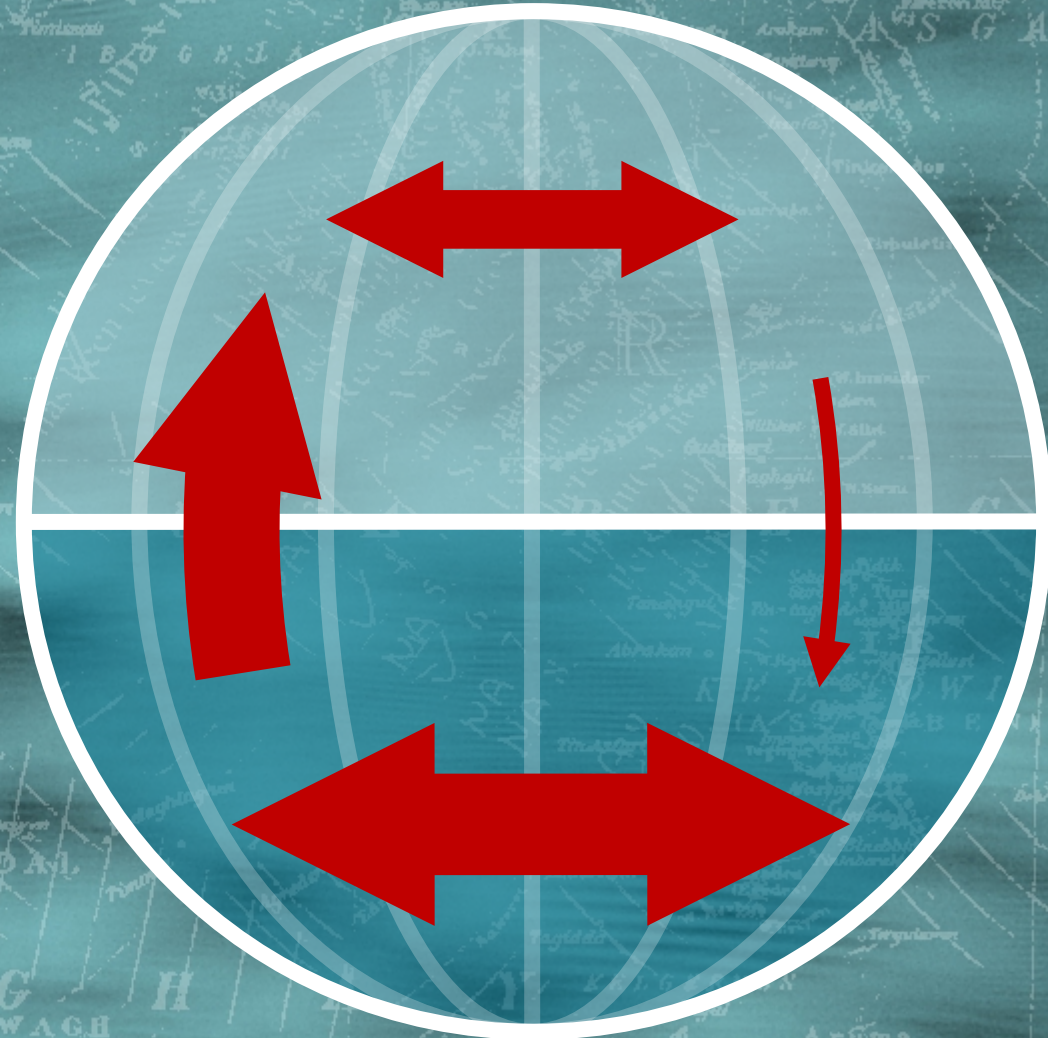
Sustainable migration is...
