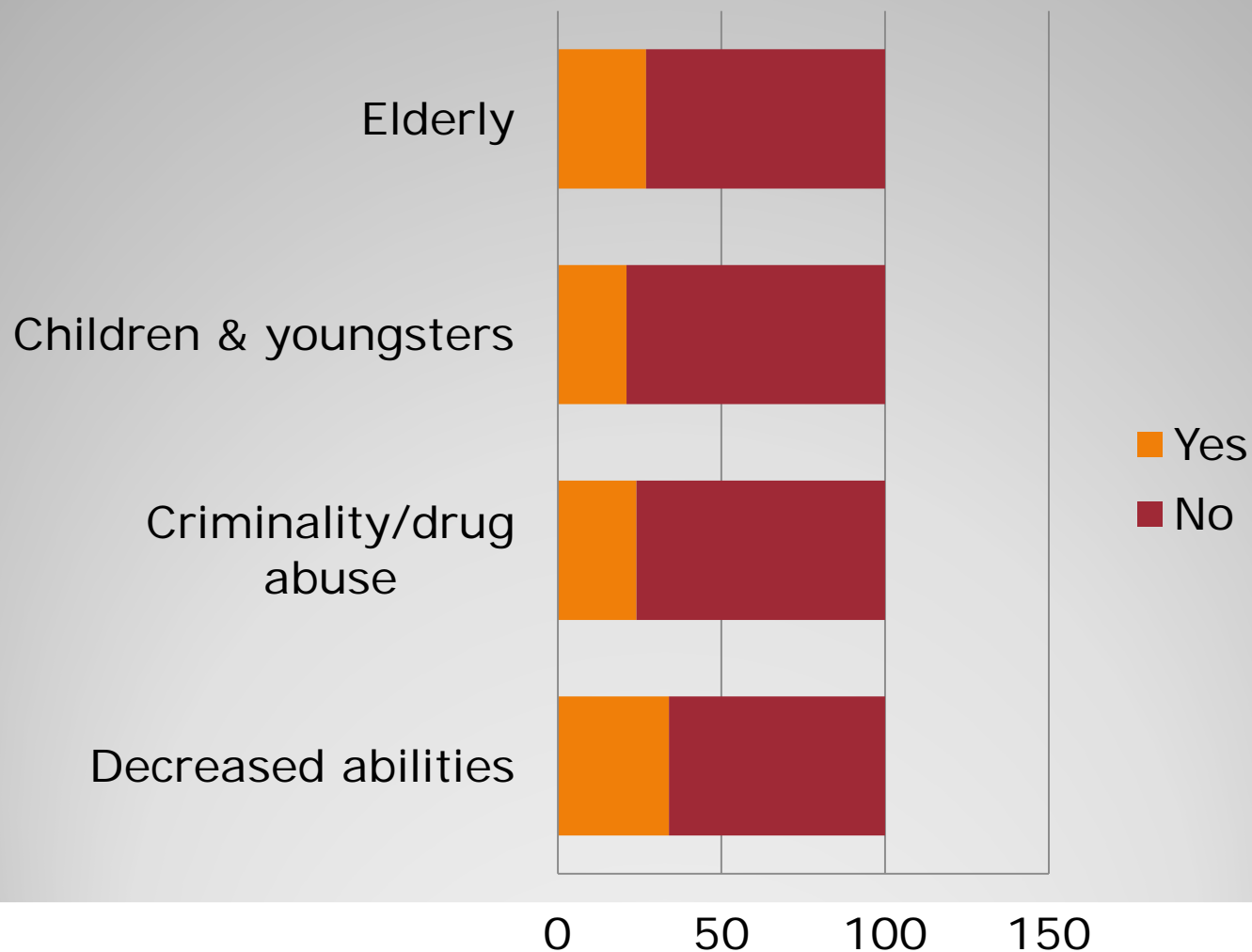

How interested are municipalities in Green care?

- Centre of Market Analysis (CMA, 2009)
- Random telephone interviews
- 202 persons
- 104 Swedish municipalities

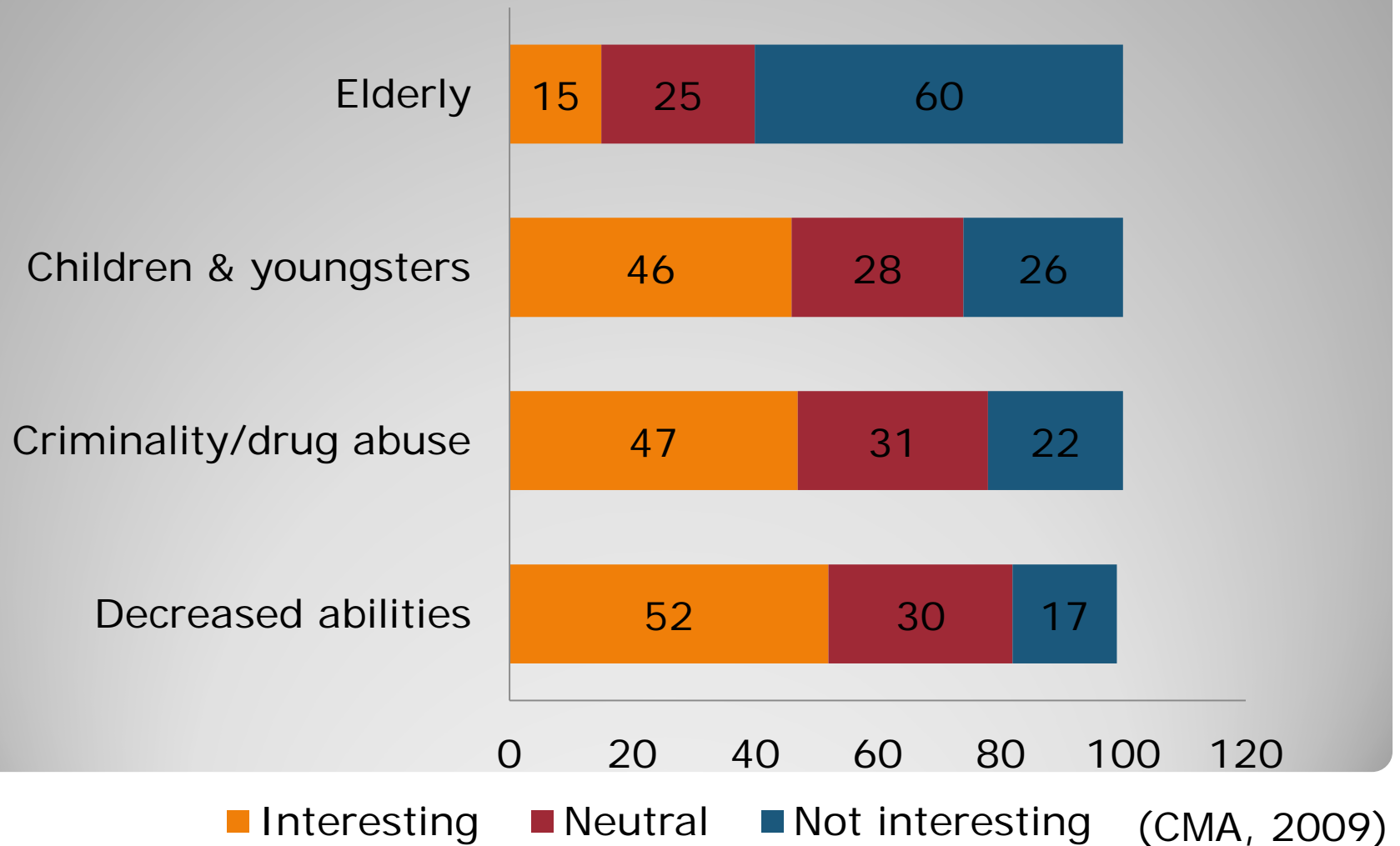


Have you heard about Green care before?

Conclusions CMA (2009)

- More positive:
 - Those who heard about Green care before
 - Municipalities using private entrepreneurs
 - Municipalities with customer- or free choice systems
 - Large municipalities (>20 000 inhabitants)
- Regional differences



Which customers are willing to buy Green care?

- Interviews of 4 selected municipalities & 3 regions with 7 municipalities
- Prefer companies in the Green sector to present a ready concept, which politicians and official officers can decide on and develop further
- Strong demand on evidence based scientific studies to support the effect of different care

On-going research

- Rehabilitation garden
 - Created in Alnarp, SLU
 - Initiated by Prof. Patrik Grahn
 - Clients with stress related syndromes, changing to clients with stroke
- Nature based rehabilitation
 - Collaboration between health care centres & farms
 - Financed by ESF & Region Skåne, FK, SLU
 - Clients with stress related syndromes



On-going research

- Wellbeing and health promoting effects of interaction with dogs in elderly care (PhD Anne Nilsson)
- The effect of massage-like stroking on stress response in dogs (PhD Anne Nilsson)
- How do educated therapy dogs (*Canis familiaris*) get affected by their work in human care? (BSc Elin Ehrén)
